Plan Purpose

Close opportunity gaps within 3 years for the populations with the largest disproportionate impact within each metric. To close gaps, we need more students within the focus population to meet the metric.

Disproportionate impact data are updated each year to track progress.

What is an opportunity gap?

An opportunity gap occurs when a subset of students based on student characteristic such as race/ethnicity, gender and other demographics are unjustifiably experiencing lower outcomes compared to the student population.

How do we measure an opportunity gap?

PPG method:

subpopulation outcome % - total college outcome %

All student groups with an opportunity gap in two or more metrics are considered a CCSF equity population.

What student groups are disaggregated?

SEA data is disaggregated by one or more of the following groups when data are available:

- Current or former foster youth
- Ethnicity
- First generation students
- Justice impacted*
- LGBTQ+ students**

- Low-income students (CCPG/Pell recipients)
- Parenting students***
- Students experiencing homelessness
- Students with disabilities (DSPS)
- Veteran students








Completion of transfer-level English in 1 year


Completed Transfer level English after 1 year - Fall 2023 Cohort

Completion of transfer-level English in 1 year






—College Average: Pass transfer level after 1 year (63.7%)

Completion of transfer-level Math in 1 year






—College Average: Pass transfer level after 1 year (66.6%)


Completion of transfer-level Math in 1 year


Completed Transfer level Mathematics after 1 year - Fall 2023 Cohort










—College Average 3-year Graduation Rate (20.8%)


Transferred to a 4-Year Institution 2020-21 Cohort within 3 Years Race/Ethnicity

Transferred to a 4-Year Institution 2020-21 Cohort within 3 Years Other Demographics






